How It Works

MCCYN is a fee assistance program that keeps affordable child care in reach for U.S. military families. It's intended for families who cannot access installation-based care due to distance or waitlists. With fee assistance, MCCYN closes the gap between what these families would pay for on-installation care and what they'd pay for care in their communities. This makes it easier for families to afford quality care from local civilian providers.

Families access MCCYN through MilitaryChildCare.com, a secure DoD gateway to military-operated or military-sponsored child care options. It provides a single online location for families to determine their MCCYN eligibility, explore qualifying providers, select a program, and apply for assistance.

MCCYN is available to Navy Active Duty Sponsors, Navy Reservists on Active Orders, and Navy Civilian Sponsors who:

- Are stationed at an installation that has been pre-identified as fee assistance eligible or
- Do not live near a DoD installation.

If the Sponsor is married, his or her spouse must be employed, actively seeking employment, or a full-time student.*

How to Use MCCYN



STEP 1

Create a MilitaryChildCare.com account.



STEP 2

Apply for MCCYN via your MilitaryChildCare.com account. To do so, select "Find Child Care" to search for care by location. If care is available in your area, place a request for fee assistance.**



STEP 3

Once you receive an offer, upload required eligibility documents under "MY MCCYN."



STEP 4

Use the message center under "MY MCCYN" to share changes to your eligibility and/or registration, including fee and provider updates.



STEP 5

Keep your contact information up to date.
